COMAL COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES DISTRICT No. 6 June 10, 2019 MINUTES

The Comal County Emergency Services District No. 6 Commissioners met in regular session June 10, 2019 at the Bracken Volunteer Fire Department (BVFD) Central Station located at 23600 FM 3009, San Antonio, Texas 78266.

Agenda Item #1. Call to order and establish quorum and pledges to the flags.

Commissioner Coley called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M. Commissioners Maschek, Solomon, Waechter, and Yannuzzi were present to establish a quorum. BVFD Fire Chief Donald Zipp and BVFD Board member (Chaplain) Skip Courter were also present.

Agenda Item #2. Approval of the minutes of the May 13, 2019 regular meeting.

Motion to accept the May 13, 2019 minutes as written was made by Commissioner Waechter and seconded by Commissioner Solomon. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #3. Receive and take action on the Treasurer's report.

Commissioner Waechter read the treasurer's report and provided each commissioner a copy of the report. As of April 30, 2019, the cash balance in bank accounts was \$2,656,933.16. Motion to accept the treasurer's report was made by Commissioner Maschek and seconded by Commissioner Yannuzzi. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #4. Take action on outstanding bills owed by the District.

Commissioner Waechter reported that there was one outstanding bill for the District. The bill was our annual charge of \$96.03 from Topsarge Business Solutions (TBS) for maintaining our ESD No 6 website. Motion to pay the outstanding bills for the District was made by Commissioner Maschek and seconded by Commissioner Solomon. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #5. Receive a report on recent activities of the Bracken Volunteer Fire Department.

Chief Zipp reported that the Department is staying busy and responded to 61 calls this month. Chief reminded the Board that the Garden Ridge Police Department and the BVFD will hold their annual pancake breakfast at Paul Davis Park on June 22, 2019 from 8:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Money raised will go to the Children's Advocacy Center of Comal County. Copper Ridge has opened its final development section and the City of New Braunfels has approved developing a multi-gated access road off FM 1863 for an emergency entrance to Copper Ridge.

Agenda Item #6. Receive a Bracken Volunteer Fire Department Board update.

BVFD Board representative Skip Courter thanked the ESD Board for their continued support of the BVFD.

Agenda Item #7. Receive Public Comment. 3-minute limit per citizen.

No public comment.

Agenda Item #8. Discussion and possible action on using committees to handle various business matters. (Reference SAFE-D ESD Handbook 1st Edition 2017 page 6, Committees)

The Board discussed using committees to handle various business matters. The committees would need well defined operational parameters and consist of board and non-board members. The real ESD No 6 test of using non-board members on committees will occur during the development of the Strategic Plan for ESD No 6. Further discussion on using committees was tabled until Agenda Item 9 was discussed.

Agenda Item #9. Update and discussion on the planning process for the development of a Strategic Plan for ESD No 6. (Commissioner Solomon)

Commissioner Solomon provided each Commissioner a packet and a detailed briefing on the Strategic Planning Process Overview for Comal County ESD No 6. (See Encl 1 and 2) He discussed strategic planning as a deliberate dynamic process for the Emergency Services District and not the specific service providers. Commissioner Solomon also discussed, "requirements-based budgeting, regulatory compliance, and understanding the geographic and demographic landscape for the future" as three reasons for a Strategic Plan. Commissioner Coley mentioned that working the Strategic Planning Process is often more important than the actual paper plan. He also stated that we (ESD No 6 Board) need to provide the Mission, Vision, and Values of ESD No 6 before we hand it off to a Planning Committee. Commissioner Solomon's recommendation was to proceed with a Strategic Planning Process and that we use a planning committee made up of Commissioners and other civilian volunteers. Commissioners Solomon and Waechter are the ESD No 6 Commissioners that will work to recruit and run the planning committee.

Agenda Item #10. Discussion and possible action on hiring AG/CM a professional construction management and estimating firm to oversee design and construction for the BVFD Sub Station and the BVFD Central Station renovation.

The commissioners, having sought a firm to provide construction management professional services, identified AG/CM Inc, a professional construction management firm. The firm has a long history of providing owner representation services for similar projects in scope and complexity to the construction projects that ESD No 6 is intending to initiate. As a result of this, the ESD#6 construction project lead spoke with an AG/CM

representative, reviewed their company capabilities, background, and work they had conducted for other government clients. A senior representative from AG/CM was interviewed to further determine their capability to provide owner representation, construction management services. Based on all of this, the commissioner's determined that AG/CM was most qualified to perform construction management services for ESD No 6. A motion was made by Commissioner Solomon, and a second by Commissioner Waechter, to have AG/CM, Inc, a professional services firm determined to be most qualified, hired to provide construction management services for ESD No 6's two construction projects (bay construction and modifications for substation and modifications and upgrades to main station). The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item #11. Update, discussion, and possible action on the EIKON designs for the BVFD Central Station renovation and the BVFD Sub Station facility. (Commissioner Yannuzzi)

Commissioner Yannuzzi recommended a letter to EIKON that would inform them that we have hired AG/CM to provide construction management services for ESD No 6. Commissioner Yannuzzi will be our representative working directly with AG/CM.

Agenda Item #12. Review, discussion, and possible action on the ESD 2020 budget process and possible dates for a budget workshop.

Commissioner Waechter provided each Commissioner with a draft CY 2020 budget based on prior years historical data and contract increase limitations. The draft will continue to be refined awaiting final figures for the 2020 tax year from the Comal County Tax Office.

Agenda Item #13. Set date, time, and location for next meeting of ESD No.6.

All commissioners agreed that the next regular meeting will be on July 8, 2019 at 6:00 P.M. at the BVFD Central Station, 23600 FM 3009, San Antonio, TX.

• Great leaders envision the future yet to be born. Strategic Plan prepares the organization for that future by meeting current requirements and deliberately planning and preparing for the changes that are predicted to occur.

- With a defined Mission and Vision, coupled with Organizational Values, the Strategic Planning Process takes the known, combines it with stakeholder input and feedback, internal and external planning factors, associated risks (known and assumed), assumptions, and defines goals with objectives and strategies to be incorporated into Action Plans to achieve the desired end state.
- Goals are prioritized with low hanging fruit accomplished as rapidly as possible; parking lot goals set aside for an appropriate time, and high priority goals, those requiring more substantial effort, worked deliberately with action teams.*
- *This strategic planning is for the Emergency Services District, not specific service provider responsibilities.

3 Reasons for Strategic Plan

• Process – deliberate vs rapid action drill. It is dynamic - Strategic planning is a process that requires feedback and course correction. What the committee learns during the planning and implementation processes may cause them to recommend that the commissioners go back and adjust their vision, goals, and initiatives.

- Strategic Planning One of the most vital aspects of an ESD's success is long-range strategic planning for the purpose of ensuring continued health of the ESD and the efficient provision of emergency services. Developing overall goals for the ESD and identifying the short-term and long-term objectives needed to achieve those goals is necessary to an ESD that desires to be run like a professional organization. With this in mind, the ESD Board should schedule at least one strategic planning session (or workshop) per year to focus on broad focused goals and activities for the ESD.
